2. Guest Speaker

- a. Nona Alexander- Veteran Case worker at Operation Delta Dog
 - i. Operation Delta Dog serves two missions; rescuing dogs from shelters and training them to be service dogs for area veterans that are living with Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD), Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) and/or

- Military Sexual Trauma (MST). Expanding to Franklin, NH area (home base in Hollis, NH), will service areas within an hour of Franklin (or further if someone is committed to coming in).
- ii. Veterans come in 1-2 times a week for classes for 5-6 months at the start. Then matches are made between the right dog and the veteran. When ready, the dog starts being integrated into the home (starting with one day, then the weekend, etc.). Then when the dog is home, veterans are trained on how to train their dog and they graduate a year after taking their dog home. Delta Dog will continue to offer support as back up.
- iii. In total: veterans commit 18 months of their time coming to class 1-2x a week. The program is 100% free. Classes are with 3-4 veterans: offer support, help to get veterans out of the house. Taking care of their dog is motivating, gets people up and about, gives people a purpose.
- iv. The dogs are trained to help with many tasks, e.g., hitting handicap buttons, picking up things, grounding technique for anxiety, acting as a barrier, helping with nightmares, and other things as needed depending on what the person's needs are.

b. Question and Answer

- i. **Jen T.-** Your services are usually for PTSD, TBI, MST- do you have plans to expand for other diagnoses?
 - 1. **Nona-** Those are the 3 base diagnoses they work with- if someone doesn't have any of those, it would depend on how things are registered with the state, etc. Many people have other diagnoses if they also have PTSD/TBI/MST, which they ask about to offer more support, but they focus on those three diagnoses.
- ii. **Jen T.-** Do you work with veterinarians in the area, how do you support that e.g., if someone doesn't have transportation, etc.
 - 1. **Nona-** They don't have partnerships with veterinarians, they ask people at the start if they can care for an animal (food, costs, etc.), they recommend pet insurance. Working on getting approved with Assistance Dogs International, which is recognized by the VA and

- the VA will cover pet insurance for service dogs for any organization that is ADI certified (currently in the candidacy stage).
- 2. Justin- VA views Certified Service Dogs like "medical equipment," will pay for food, supplies, etc. as part of managing a medical condition. Does not have to be only for physical conditions but must be a Certified Service Dog and connected to a diagnosed condition.
- iii. **Jen T.-** What do you need for training- brick and mortar space or can you use someone else's space?
 - Nona- Can use someone else's space, what they need for the training is minimal- currently using a room at a VA in Jamaica Plains- but the need for staff is the hardest part.
- iv. Soyla- Where do you get your dogs, and do you use only a certain breed?
 - 1. **Nona** Dogs from any shelter, usually down South, typically work with Lab mixes.
- v. **Mark** Do you have service dogs for other conditions, e.g., Gulf War Syndrome?
 - Nona- Not aware of their service dogs for that, Delta Dog training is focused on psychiatric and physical (balance, back issues, etc.).
 Not sure if that is possible, or what would go into that training, she'll bring it up to the trainers.
- vi. **Donny-** Does the veteran need to have condition linked to a VA condition/disability?
 - 1. **Justin** Probably yes (but not 100% sure). Veterans should reach out to Primary Care at VA, who will connect them to a social worker at VA who will help with the process.
 - 2. **Lindsay** VA provides a list of organizations that are accredited, veterans can reach out to the organization and see if they're a good fit with the organization, then come back and talk to social worker to get bills/paperwork taken care of.

3. Updates

a. Jen T.

- i. Spoke to Eric Eason Carelon
 - 1. Holds the DHHS contract to manage the 988 data.
 - 2. Takes overflow call from Mobile Crisis unit.
 - 3. Separate from Veterans' Crisis Line
 - 4. 988 operators encouraged to ask about veteran status, but it is not protocol.
 - 5. General/gatekeeper training on veteran culture and needs.
 - 6. Data collected is not a good representation of veteran information.
 - 7. Approached VA to increase collaboration but there are barriers.
 - a. Inconsistent data because they're not required to ask if someone is a veteran, so they don't know the real numbers.
 - b. It's convoluted what the process is for someone to get from 988 to the Veteran Crisis Line.
- ii. ASIST training September 11/12
 - 1. Everybody liked it, very comprehensive, involved.
 - 2. Looking to see if we can get it back up here in January.
 - 3. Online trainings- E-connect gatekeeping trainings. Contact Jen T. if interested.

- e. **Chris Lalmond** ApprenticeshipNH works to connect partners and employers, high schools/colleges to build apprenticeships or pre-apprenticeships. People can come to Chris if they are interested, and he can also connect them with Ryan.
- f. **Ryan Gould-** Part of the Department of Labor (federal side) Office of Apprenticeship- registering agency for NH for any apprenticeship programs. Ryan's specialty is veteran employment, and he's pushing to get veterans into apprenticeship programs. Working to change the mentality of apprenticeship program- have occupations from healthcare, schooling, plumbing, to electrical engineering, can work across borders depending on the company. Trying to get this news out and wants to connect with people and provide info.
- g. **Justin and Jen** will be at Fryeburg Fair on Friday Oct. 6 with info and flyers, anyone is welcome to stop by.
- h. **Eric Esty** social worker from the Berlin Vet Center- the Vet Center is part of Department of Veteran Affairs- focuses on mental health counseling and readjustment counseling. They don't diagnose or prescribe medication (work with VA for that). Eric comes down to Conway every Friday to meet with veterans at Conway Church of Christ (348 E Main St., Conway, NH 03818). Contact him for more info: (603) 752-2571. Their eligibility is always changing but please send

- people to them for services. There is another Vet Center in Manchester/Hookset. It's free of charge and funded by the VA, wants to get the word out for their services.
- i. **Tom Southern** from Wolfeboro American Legion Post 18- We meet every 3rd Monday at the Post, any Veterans/guests are welcome. There is no Wolfeboro Veterans Day parade, but there will be an event at Wright Museum on Veterans Day at 11am (~1.5 hours). There will be speakers, videos, etc., anyone welcome-boy/girl scouts, DAR, etc., the room holds about 100 people- contact him for more info.
