- 2. Introduce Building Dreams for Marines- Home | Building Dreams for Marines (bdfm.org)
 - a. Mark Detering- Board of Directors for Building Dreams for Marines
 - b. Building Dreams for Marines assists veterans from any branch of service (not just Marines) who have mobility challenges with life-enhancing modifications to their homes or vehicles at no cost to them. Assists with the planning, design, and construction of modifications/home improvements (e.g. interior and exterior ramps, widening of doorways/hallways, grab bars, etc.) and vehicle modifications including making controls hand-operated
 - c. Qualifications: Veterans of any branch of service as long as they were honorably discharged, have a physically limiting condition (does not have to be as a result from a combat role), and must be a NH resident that owns the property to be modified. They ask veterans for their DD214 and ask them to complete the VA HISA application in case that can provide more funding (but veterans do not have to be VA eligible).
 - d. Process: Fill out the application on the website, committee reviews and visits, and once accepted it's passed to the projects team who can find a contractor and work out the details (or the veteran can also choose their own contractor).
 - e. How can CCVC support Building Dreams for Marines- Spread the word with service clubs, contractors, and building supply



organizations. Mark can do a presentation for organizations that help seniors or service organizations (Meals on Wheels, Kiwanis, etc.). Mark is already connected to Conway Meals on Wheels, Cranmore, the Fire Department, and a contractor in Freedom and will be in Gorham in August to connect with North Country Vets.

- f. Jen T. can connect him with the local sports adaptation organization in Conway and will send out the one-page summary of Building Dreams for Marines in the minutes and share it with the Gibson Center, VNA, and Adult Day Center.

Vote in Honor of a Veteran




Veterans and service members protect our most precious freedom - the right to vote.


