		Major Concerns: Lack of support available for veterans, lack of support for young veterans, lack of transportation for healthcare and socialization, isolation, communication issues with veteran groups/supports, and lack of support for female veterans.
		Gary- Concern: Not enough people helping veterans, not enough support for
		young veterans, communication issues, access to care, potential contacts- In MA every community has a Veterans Department (351), VSOs, NSOs, 500 people advocating for veterans- involved with suicide prevention, disability applications, helping buy homes, Dr. appointments, etc. Communication issues in NH- no response when calling services. Need more groups helping veterans, especially young veterans. Lack of communication from veteran groups to veterans. Only 3 people per county are helping veterans in NH. Important to get political people involved, many claim they will help but are not involved after they are elected. Making good contacts is important. Swim with a Mission- great organization with lots of resources, would come to the meeting if invited, hosting Pets for Vets Gala. Delta Dog- another great organization. NH has lost 90 troops in combat, 900 to suicide. Not enough people in NH for veterans to reach out to (many go back to MA). Justin- Concern: Need more support/people- Veteran Service Organizations have VSOs (veterans service officers) but they are overworked- they must find veterans in the community, get them connected, do risk assessments. Access to care is very
		important. Need more support in NH.
		988 is good but needs to follow through with veterans for care (long term follow-up). Gary- Some veterans not even in VA healthcare because they didn't know they qualify, has been helping them sending out applications and following through with them.
		Jen- Ask the Veterans Campaign to help spread the word.
		David: Potential contact - Invite Humble Grunt Work in Center Harbor to this meeting- new grassroots group that does fundraising events, transitional housing for veterans, suicide prevention. Contact Carla Taylor (603) 986-1488.
		Lindsay: Concern- Transportation issues and isolation- Works in primary care and

case management- Concerns: Lack of transportation in area, many veterans isolated

	and don't have family to help them. Veterans with appointments in Portland and
	Manchester (for specialists), but no transportation to get to them. This ties into
	suicide prevention because people need access to care. Isolation- Veterans don't have
	ties to communities or people that check in on them- those are the veterans that feel
	most hopeless about their situation.
	Jen- Ideas for transportation at least for Carroll County/ North Conway, putting out
	flyers for volunteer drivers.
	Justin- Need transportation not just to appointments but to anything, like
	transportation to community events, socializing. VA/CDC- came up with national
	suicide prevention plan- best practices- including access to care, reducing social
	isolation, screening for risk, supporting and following through people in crisis,
	transitions in care, lethal means reduction- 70% of veteran suicide happen by firearm-
	== -
	need to improve culture of safety and manage firearms safely- engage with local gun
	shops (they can hold on to firearms until person is in better place). Opposite of
	suicide is hope and reducing stigma, supporting people and networking.
	Gary- Coffee social and upcoming event- Coffee social in Madison- at one point
	had up to 30 veterans involved, some mentioned transportation issues so they created
	a transportation list, veterans picking each other up to come. For some veterans the
	coffee social is the highlight of their day to come out and socialize and tell stories.
	Upcoming Event: Black Hawk helicopter coming to Madison on August 5 at 10am-
	trying to get veterans and kids to come. The goal is to make more events that will
	draw veterans out. Can help with reaching out to people, finding funding for the
	group. Will talk to the woman running the Coffee Social about joining this group.
	Jen-Trying to find activities to bring people together- coffee social, BBQ, etc.
	Mark- Find veteran owned businesses to help.
	Jennifer: Concern- Female veterans- Even worse situation, people assume women
	aren't not veterans, healthcare issues- can't get appointment for months because the
	VA is forcing a women's care provider for any health issue. Need to do outreach for
	women, there are no women's veterans groups/coalitions around here.
	Justin - Women were only formally allowed in combat 20 years ago, so now the first round of women is retiring. In NH female veterans one of the fastest growing groups,
	in Carroll County veterans are on the older side and the percentage of the population
	in Carroll County that are veterans is greater than in other parts of the state.
	Gary- Agree, need more groups for women veterans. Justin- Working on project for state-wide coalition for women's veterans, looking for
Ш	hosting facilitator- Jen in Carroll County? Many places don't have capacity right now
	for a new group.
	Lindsay- There will be changes to the clinic, working with providers for services for
	female veterans.
	Jennifer- That is great, but haven't seen changes yet, some people don't have other
	healthcare options- beholden to VA and the 24 hours a month that there is a female
	healthcare provider there.

		Justin- There are some female veterans with MST (military sexual trauma) and PTSD (post-traumatic stress disorder), must figure out best way to handle each veteran individually.
		David- David is the only person that helps veterans at Huggins. He was a training officer for VSOs in MA. David would like to talk with Gary.
		Lindsay- Potential contacts- Two VSOs to approach for this coalition: Ken McGovern- American Legion (Gary has info), State VSO- Bill (603) 624-9230 ext. 301- goes to scheduler. Jill at Gibson Center- involved in Veterans groups and puts on veterans' groups at Gibson. (Jen reached out, Jill will try to be involved if possible).
		Justin - Some people jump on board later as things get started; some people want to see if the meetings actually happen.
		David- Potential contact- State Vet Director is William Gaudreau at (603) 624-9230 ext. 302
		Justin - Some places have a veterans community center- place for veterans to socialize.
		Gary - NH politician had said they would open a veterans' center in Concord, but it never happened.
		Jennifer- Concern: Female veterans- People asking for women veteran contacts/groups in NH, wanting to connect. Some women hesitant to join groups created/run by men.
		Gary- MA- created women's division/department of veterans' services, every state should have one
		Justin - peer support also important, for example, people who can come to ER with veteran, etc. Franklin NH Easter Seals Military and Veterans Campus- trying to create housing, services and support- Lakes Region Veterans Coalition will be involved, along with Delta Dog, equine therapy.
		Outcomes we would like to see-
		Possible activities, trainings, or speakers? Jen-Would like to do suicide prevention training for the group, such as Psycharmor-
		an online training that takes a couple hours.
		Justin- If the group prefers in-person, he knows of 3 suicide prevention coordinators
		that could help, can be connected.
