d. Any pertinent updates?

Ed Currier- Clear Path for Veterans New England in Manchester NH.
 Works to help homeless veterans by providing financial support for housing stabilization, housing prevention, and rapid housing for homeless veterans, through a VA funded grant.

- ii. Nicole Frisella- Coordinated Entry Specialist for homeless services at the Manchester VA- supports homeless team and works with the state, COCs, and coalitions.
- iii. Dan Bricker- Homeless Outreach Social Worker at Manchester VA, in this group to network and ensure people know to reach out to him if they know of any veterans experiencing homelessness. He covers up to Carroll County, north of that and the exterior counties (Coos, Sullivan, and Grafton counties) are covered by White River Junction VA.
- iv. Ann Cady- Veteran, retired counselor, and local minister. Part of this group because currently looking for where to give time and help organizations.
- v. Paula Roby-Palmer- Coordinator for NH Senior Companion program. The program matches volunteers aged 55+ with homebound seniors who are 55+ and the program would like to have more veteran volunteers matched with homebound veterans. Currently, they have one companion available in Ossipee and they also have one veteran companion in Concord which has been going well. If the senior can't leave the home, then companions do things in their home like games, movies, etc. and if the senior can leave the home, companions can go to the grocery store, appointments, or social outings with them. It is a federally funded program and is free except if they leave the house, it's 37 cents per mile. Volunteers get \$4/hour stipend and are reimbursed for milage. Doesn't currently offer suicide prevention training.
- vi. Donald Olsen- Clinical Director at TERRA, army veteran, looking to reach veterans in the area and coordinate services. TERRA is focusing primarily on mental health plus some horsemanship skills.
- vii. Jennifer Walton- 24-year active navy veteran, quartermaster of Ossipee VFW Post 8270, husband, Mark Allen, is the commander. The VFW is in desperate need of more members (talking about possibly having to shut down), please reach out to her or Mark if you know of anyone who is interested (must be a veteran of a foreign war and individuals who were stationed in Korea for 30+ days are eligible).

 - e. Discussion about bringing back a Stand Down to Carroll County- had previously had mini pop up Stand Down in Carroll County before Covid. Stand Downs are one stop shops for homeless veterans- typically have court system services to clear tickets, VA with services, showers, meals, dental services, haircuts, tents for people to sleep in- as many different community providers as possible, all by donation. Jen T. will also talk to the Way Station about a Stand Down. Donald and Nicole are also interested in a Stand Down.
 - f. Donald Olsen- Interested in having a speaker come who has more info about being a community provider and getting that funding. Ed can put him in contact

with someone with more info and Jen T. can reach out to Justin Moeling for help with that. TERRA is also participating in a peer-to-peer fundraising campaign, Seen Through Horses, a grassroots funding campaign in May for Mental Health Awareness Month. Encouraging people to participate in programs of their choice-e.g. funds can be earmarked for veteran programs. If anyone is interested, reach out, there is fundraising training involved, he will put together a flyer and send it to Jen T. to share with the group.
